Description of the processing of personal data in scientific research (Data Protection Notice EU (679/2016) Articles 13, 14, 30)

Personal data processed in the study Enhancing Athletes' Resilience through Financial Knowledge

The survey is used to produce information on the financial literacy, financial challenges and support needs of Finnish, Bulgarian, Romanian and Slovakian athletes. In the study, the following personal data will be collected from you: nationality, age group, gender, level of competition and dual career status. These data are not directly identifying personal data, but by combining them it may be possible to identify a respondent, and for this reason they are processed as personal data.

A link to this notice is provided at the beginning of the survey.

Legal basis for the processing of personal data in research/archiving

The processing of your personal data is necessary for scientific research carried out in the public interest pursuant to Section 4(3) of the Data Protection Act. Special categories of personal data are processed for scientific research purposes in accordance with Section 6(7) of the Data Protection Act. The prohibition on processing special categories of personal data is derogated from because the research data are processed for archiving purposes in the public interest (Data Protection Act Section 6(1)(8)).

Transfer of personal data outside the EU/EEA

Your data will not be transferred outside the EU/EEA.

Protection of personal data

The processing of personal data in this study is based on an appropriate research plan, and the study has a responsible person. Your personal data are used and disclosed only for scientific research or other compatible purposes (statistics) and otherwise handled in such a way that information concerning you is not disclosed to third parties. The results of the study will not be reported in such a way that an individual respondent can be identified.

Removal of identifiability

No direct identifiers are collected from the data subjects at any stage of the study. Indirect identifiers (such as nationality, age group, gender) are retained in the data for scientific research and statistical purposes but are not reported in such a way that an individual respondent can be identified. Indirect identifiers are not disclosed further in such a way that they can be linked to a specific respondent and their responses.

Protection of personal data processed in the study

The data contained in the research material are protected by firewalls, passwords and other generally accepted technical means in the field of information security. Personal data are accessible only to members of the research group who are familiar with the data protection regulation and secure data processing.

Processing of personal data after the completion of the study

The research register will be archived after the completion of the study on KIHU's secure server. Identifiable data are retained on the basis of public interest for scientific research purposes, meaning that the processing of

research data containing personal data for archiving purposes is necessary for a task carried out in the public interest (Data Protection Act Section 4(4)). The prohibition on processing special categories of personal data is derogated from because the research data are processed for archiving purposes in the public interest (Data Protection Act Section 6(1)(8)). The necessity of retaining the research register is assessed annually. The disclosure of data for further research use is assessed on a case-by-case basis, ensuring that the data security of the data subjects is not compromised in any situation.

Research performers

The research group includes Leading Expert Jari Lämsä, Senior Researcher Kaisu Mononen, Senior Researcher Jarmo Mäkinen and Expert Sanna Pusa from Finnish Institute of High Performance Sport KIHU.

Personal data are processed by the responsible researchers of the study. The responsible researchers are responsible for data management and disclose data on a case-by-case basis to other members of the research group in such a way that the data protection of the data subjects is not compromised.

In the study, personal data are also processed by the survey software provider Webropol, with whom KIHU has a data processing agreement.

Rights of the data subject

Right of access (Article 15 GDPR)

You have the right to obtain confirmation as to whether your personal data are being processed and what personal data are being processed. You may also request a copy of the personal data being processed.

Right to rectification (Article 16 GDPR)

If your personal data are inaccurate or incomplete, you have the right to request their rectification or completion.

Right to erasure (Article 17 GDPR)

You have the right to request the deletion of your personal data in certain cases. However, this right does not apply if the deletion would prevent or seriously impair the achievement of the purposes of scientific research.

Right to restriction of processing (Article 18 GDPR)

You have the right to request the restriction of processing of your personal data in certain situations, such as when you contest the accuracy of your personal data.

Right to object (Article 21 GDPR)

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data if the processing is based on public interest or legitimate interest. In such a case, KIHU may no longer process your personal data unless it can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing which override your rights.

Deviation from rights

The rights described above may be restricted in certain individual cases on the basis of the GDPR and the Finnish Data Protection Act to the extent that the rights would prevent or seriously impair the achievement of scientific or historical research purposes or statistical purposes. The need for derogation is always assessed on a case-by-case basis.

Profiling and automated decision-making

Personal data are not used for automated decision-making in this study. The purpose of the processing is not to evaluate your personal characteristics (profiling), but to assess personal data and characteristics from the perspective of broader scientific research.

Accomplishing the rights of the data subject

If you have questions about your rights, you may contact the responsible researcher or the Data Protection Officer.

You have the right to lodge a complaint, in particular with a supervisory authority in the Member State of your habitual residence or place of work, if you consider that the processing of personal data infringes the General Data Protection Regulation (EU) 2016/679. In Finland, the supervisory authority is the Office of the Data Protection Ombudsman.
